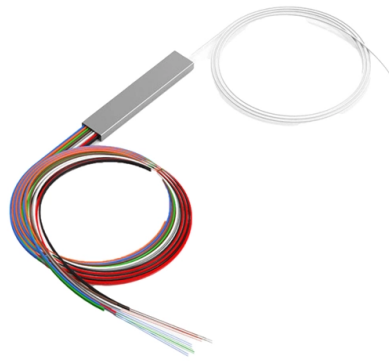


Allowing access to core switches

Access to core switches should be carefully managed using management VLANs, proper IP routing, and secure protocols like SSH to ensure network stability and security.

Understanding Core and Access Switch Roles

A core switch is a high-capacity, high-performance device located at the backbone of a network. It aggregates traffic from multiple access and distribution switches and often serves as the gateway to WAN or Internet connections . Access switches, on the other hand, connect end devices such as PCs, IP phones, and wireless access points to the network and typically operate at Layer 2, forwarding traffic based on MAC addresses .

Best Practices for Accessing Core Switches

- Use a Management VLAN: Create a dedicated VLAN for management purposes on both core and access switches. Assign IP addresses to the VLAN interfaces (SVIs) to allow remote management . For example, VLAN 100 could be used with the core switch IP 192.168.100.1 and access switch IP 192.168.100.20 .
- Configure IP Routing and Default Gateways: Ensure that access switches have their default gateway set to the core switch's management VLAN IP. Enable IP routing if Layer 3 functionality is required
