

Cable trays are separated from supports



Overview

This design note adopts a 300 mm horizontal air-gap separation between primary and secondary life-safety trays on roofs, based on these regulatory requirements and established UK guidance. BS 7671:2018 +A2:2022 states: "Circuits of safety services shall be independent of other. In addition, a cable support system can be used to separate and arrange cables in groups. The systems are installed on ceilings, walls or floors. Various galvanisation surfaces can be applied to improve corrosion. maintain spacing or to keep cables in place when the tray is ect the minimum bend ra-dius for cables as they exit the bottom of the cable tray. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray cont d for instrumentation and control applications that require. UK electrical and fire safety standards do not prescribe a fixed minimum separation distance for roof-mounted life-safety cable trays. It is recommended that the work described be performed by a competent person(s) familiar with standard electrical installation. These systems, made from metal or plastic, are open structures designed to support electrical conductors, ensuring proper organization and safety.
