

Can UPS cable trays and low-voltage cable trays be combined



Article Overview

UPS cables and low-voltage cables should generally be separated, but can share a tray if proper dividers, shielding, and spacing are implemented.

Regulatory Guidelines

According to the National Electrical Code (NEC) Article 300.3(C)(1), power cables (like UPS circuits) and low-voltage cables (control, communication, or instrumentation) cannot be mixed in the same tray unless specific separation or shielding measures are applied . Similarly, IEC 60364-5-52 recommends physical separation or shielding to prevent electromagnetic interference (EMI) between high-power and sensitive low-voltage circuits .

Risks of Combining Cables

- **Electromagnetic Interference (EMI):** UPS cables carry significant current and can generate magnetic fields that disrupt low-voltage signals, causing data errors or control malfunctions .
- **Voltage Induction:** High-power cables may induce voltages in nearby low-voltage circuits, potentially damaging sensitive equipment .
- **Fire Hazards:** Overcrowding or improper grouping can lead to overheating, increasing fire risk .
