Hot-Pluggable Design: SFP modules can be inserted or removed from network devices without powering them down, simplifying maintenance and minimizing downtime during upgrades or replacements . **Compact Form Factor:** The small size (approximately 21mm × 14mm × 56mm) allows high port density in switches, routers, and servers, making them more space-efficient than older GBIC modules . **Data Rate Support:** Different SFP families support varying speeds: SFP (1G), SFP+ (up to 10G), and SFP28 (25G), enabling scalable network performance . **Media Flexibility:** SFP modules support multiple transmission media, including single-mode fiber, multi-mode fiber, and copper cables, allowing deployment across diverse network environments . **Optical and Electrical Conversion:** Optical SFPs contain a Transmit Optical Subassembly (TOSA) and Receive Optical Subassembly (ROSA) to handle fiber signals, while copper SFPs integrate PHY and magnetics for Ethernet over twisted pair . **Digital Diagnostic Monitoring (DDM/DOM):** Modern SFP modules provide real-time telemetry, including temperature, supply voltage, and transmit/receive optical power, enabling proactive fault detection and predictive maintenance . **Standardization and Interoperability:** SFP modules conform to Multi-Source Agreements (MSAs), ensuring mechanical, electrical, and operational compatibility across vendors, though electrical and optical compatibility must still be verified for each deployment . **Power Efficiency:** Typically consuming under 1W, SFP modules reduce energy usage and heat genera...
