

Core switches have built-in firewalls

Core switches do not typically have full built-in firewalls; they can perform basic traffic filtering, but dedicated firewalls are required for comprehensive security.

Core Switch Capabilities

Core switches are primarily designed for high-speed packet forwarding and routing within the network backbone. They can handle large volumes of traffic between aggregation layers and provide Layer 3 routing, VLAN segmentation, and sometimes basic security filtering using Access Control Lists (ACLs). ACLs allow core switches to block or permit traffic based on IP addresses, protocols, or ports, but this is not equivalent to a full firewall.

Firewall Functions

A firewall is a dedicated security device that monitors and controls network traffic according to detailed security policies. Modern next-generation firewalls (NGFWs) provide stateful inspection, deep packet inspection, intrusion prevention, and application-layer filtering. These capabilities go beyond what core switches can offer, including protection against sophisticated threats and enforcement of security zones.

Integration in Enterprise Networks

In enterprise designs, core switches and firewalls complement each other. Core switches handle high-speed routing and inter-VLAN traffic, while firewalls enforce security policies at network boundaries or between security zones. Some vendors, I...
