The connection length of a cold joint depends on proper reinforcement overlap and timing between concrete pours, typically guided by structural design codes rather than a fixed universal length.

Understanding Cold Joints

A cold joint occurs when fresh concrete is poured against concrete that has already started to set, preventing full integration between the two layers. This can create a plane of weakness, especially if the joint is in tension or exposed to water infiltration . Cold joints are not gaps but seams that may contain small voids if not properly compacted .

Timing Considerations

To minimize cold joint issues, the time gap between successive pours should generally not exceed 30 minutes, though this can vary depending on temperature, cement type, and concrete mix . Longer delays increase the risk of weak bonding and potential structural problems.

Reinforcement and Connection Length

The connection length at a cold joint is primarily determined by the overlap of reinforcing bars (rebar) or the use of dowels across the joint:

- **Rebar Overlap:** For construction joints, the reinforcing bars from the first pour sho...
