

Do all outdoor distribution boxes need to be grounded

Outdoor distribution boxes must be properly grounded using copper conductors, separate ground rods, and tested to ensure a maximum resistance of 25 ohms to comply with safety standards and NEC requirements.

Key Grounding Principles

Separate Grounding: Outdoor distribution boxes should have a grounding system independent of nearby fences or other structures unless specifically noted on project drawings. This ensures that faults in the distribution box do not energize unrelated structures (). **Ground Rods and Conductors:** Use vertical copper-bonded ground rods spaced appropriately (commonly 50 feet apart for large installations) and connect them to the distribution box using copper conductors. For buried runs, copper is preferred over aluminum to prevent corrosion and degradation over time (). **Wire Sizing:** Grounding conductors should be sized according to the overcurrent protection rating of the distribution box. Oversizing can cause bonding issues, while undersizing may fail to safely carry fault currents (). **Bonding:** All metallic parts of the distribution box, including neutral and ground bars, must be bonded to the grounding system. For multi-phase systems, neutral bushings should also be connected to the ground to ensure proper fault current paths (). **Resistance Testing:** After installation, the grounding system should be tested to ensure a maximum resistance of 25 ohms. This ensures that the system can safely dissipate fault currents into the earth ().
