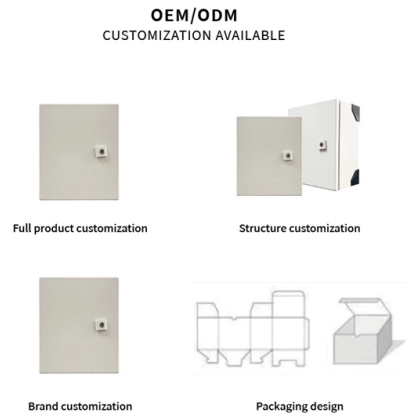


Does a two-wire pigtail count as one core



Overview

Pigtails or wires that are part of the switch do not count towards box fill. Any device will count as two conductors. It looks like you have. An electrical pigtail is a short length of wire that bridges multiple circuit conductors to a single device terminal, keeping downstream outlets and switches powered even when one device is pulled out for repair. The technique is sometimes optional and sometimes required by the National Electrical. Could I have 3" in of wiring coming in then pigtail another 3"?

Or do I need to have 6" coming in regardless as one wire then anything pigtailed is extra?

I want to have minimal wire in there to eliminate any potential shorts. It ensures a secure connection by combining wires with a wire connector, like a twist-on connector or a wire nut, and then linking them to the intended terminal or fixture. Pigtails serve. The wires are counted by size and type for example 14 awg wire is 2 cubic inches for each hot, neutral and only counted once for the ground, if you have a pig tail that doesn't add to the count, if you have 12 awg wire it is 2. This technique ensures the device is.

Installing some outlets and pigtailling with wagos. I want to make sure I don't have too much wire in the box. I know code is 1/4inch of insulation in the box, 6" of total conductor and 3" extended out the box.

How do you count conductors that are pigtailed (box fill)?

The device or switch/ receptacle counts 2x the cu inches of the largest wire connecting to it so if a 12 gauge wire connects the receptacle takes 4.5 cu inches.
