

Does the cable tray exceed the required height

If a cable tray is installed too high, it can be lowered or supported differently to meet NEC clearance requirements and improve accessibility for maintenance.

NEC Clearance Requirements

According to the 2026 NEC update, cable trays must have at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above them to allow for installation and maintenance access . If your tray is too high, it may violate this requirement and make cable handling difficult.

Practical Solutions

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Lowering the Tray:

- If the tray is suspended from the ceiling using trapeze hangers or cantilever brackets, you can adjust the hangers to reduce the height. Ensure that the new position maintains proper support intervals and load capacity .

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Adding Intermediate Supports:

- For long spans, adding additional supports can allow you to lower sections of the tray without compromising structural integrity. Shorter support intervals (e.g., ever...
