

Does the secondary distribution box on the construction site need to be grounded



Article Overview

Yes, a secondary distribution box (sub panel) must be properly grounded, but the method depends on whether it is in the same building as the main panel or in a detached structure.

Grounding Principles

A sub panel is a secondary distribution point that extends electrical service from the main panel. Proper grounding is essential for safety, providing a low-impedance path for fault currents to return to the source, allowing overcurrent protection devices to trip quickly, and stabilizing the system against surges or lightning strikes .

Separation of Neutral and Ground

In a sub panel, the neutral conductor must be isolated from the panel's metal enclosure and grounding bus. Unlike the main service panel, where the neutral is bonded to the ground, bonding the neutral in a sub panel can create parallel paths for current, potentially energizing metal parts and creating shock hazards .
