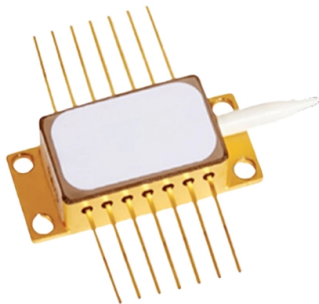

Key Principles for Managing Excess Fiber

- **Maintain Minimum Bend Radius** Fiber optic cables are sensitive to bending. Always ensure that the cable loops inside the distribution box respect the manufacturer's minimum bend radius to prevent macrobends and signal degradation .
- **Use Structured Storage Solutions** Employ fiber trays, slack spools, or dedicated storage units to organize excess cable. Devices like the C2Storage Fiber Tray allow compact, high-density storage while keeping fibers accessible and reducing the risk of tangling .
- **Organize and Secure Cables** Use hook-and-loop ties, Velcro straps, or cable management clips to bundle and secure excess fiber. Avoid tight knots or adhesive tapes that can damage the fiber sheath .
- **Plan for Future Expansion** Leave sufficient slack for maintenance, repairs, or network upgrades. Excess fiber should be coiled neatly in loops or stored in trays without overlapping or compressing other cables .
- **Protect from Physical Stress** Ensure that cables are not crushed, pinched, or exposed to sharp edges. Use protective raceways or guides within the box to prevent accidental damage during installation or maintenance .
- **Label and Document** Clearly label each fiber and its corresponding loop to simplify troubleshooting and future modifications. Proper documentation reduces downtime and prevents accidental disconnections
