

Fiber optic broadband cable connection methods



Article Overview

Fiber optic cables can be connected using active connectors, cold splicing, fusion splicing, or mechanical/physical connections, each suited for different installation needs and performance requirements.

1. Active Connection (Connector-Based)

Active connections use fiber optic connectors such as LC, SC, or ST to join cables via plugs and sockets. This method is flexible, convenient, and allows easy reconfiguration of networks. Typical light loss is around 1 dB per connection, and while connectors may lose 10-20% of light, they are ideal for short-term or modular setups like building network cabling. Proper cleaning and inspection of connectors are essential to prevent signal degradation.

2. Cold Splicing (Mechanical or Emergency Connection)

Cold splicing, also called mechanical splicing, involves aligning and securing fiber ends in a sleeve using mechanical or chemical bonding. It is quick and reliable for temporary or emergency connections, with typical attenuation of 0.1-0.3 dB per splice. This method is suitable for short-term use but may become unstable over time. It requires precise cutting and alignment of fibers, often completed in minutes by trained personnel.
