

Fiber optic cable pole-mounted home access



Article Overview

For home access, pole-mounted fiber optic cables should be armored, weather-resistant, and compatible with single-mode networks, ensuring reliable outdoor performance and ONT connectivity.

Cable Selection

When choosing a pole-mounted fiber optic cable for residential use, prioritize:

- **Armored Construction:** Protects the fiber from physical damage, pets, and environmental hazards. Stainless steel or similar armored tubes are common for outdoor runs ().
- **LSZH Jackets:** Low Smoke Zero Halogen jackets reduce toxic emissions in case of fire and are suitable for both indoor and outdoor segments ().
- **Single-Mode Compatibility:** OS1/OS2 fibers are standard for FTTH networks, ensuring low-loss transmission over long distances ().
- **Connector Types:** SC/APC or LC/APC connectors are preferred for ONT connections, as APC connectors reduce back reflections and improve signal quality ().
- **Length and Routing:** Select cable lengths that minimize splices while allowing flexibility for routing from the pole to the ONT inside the home (). Popular options include the Bangun 50-foot armored patch cable and VANDESAIL 30-meter outdoor armored cable, both designed for outdoor pole mounting and home ONT relocation ()....
