

How to connect the dedicated pigtail to the fiber optic box

Connecting a fiber optic pigtail to a fiber optic box is done by splicing the bare end of the pigtail to the incoming fiber and securing the connector end in the box for reliable, low-loss connections.

Step-by-Step Process

1. Prepare the Fiber and Pigtail Carefully strip the outer coating of the incoming fiber and the pigtail to expose the glass core. Clean both fibers with alcohol wipes to remove dust and debris, as even small particles can cause signal loss . 2. Cleave the Fiber Use a precision fiber cleaver to make a clean, perpendicular cut on both the incoming fiber and the pigtail. Proper cleaving ensures optimal alignment during splicing . 3. Fusion Splicing Place the prepared fibers into a fusion splicer. The splicer aligns the fibers and fuses them together using an electric arc, creating a permanent, low-loss joint. Some installations may use mechanical splicing as an alternative, but fusion splicing is preferred for long-term reliability . 4. Protect the Splice After splicing, slide a heat-shrink sleeve over the joint and apply heat to protect the splice from mechanical stress and environmental factors . 5. Install the Pigtail in the Fiber Box Insert the connector end of the pigtail into the appropriate port or adapter in the fiber optic box (such as an Optical Distribution Frame or splice tray). Ensure the connector clicks securely into place . 6. Test the Connection Use an Optical Time-Domain Reflectometer (OTDR) or a power meter to verify the splice quality and signal performance. This step ensures minimal attenuation and proper network operation
