- LC connectors: Often have a small tab; press the tab and pull the connector straight out.
- ST connectors: Twist the connector counterclockwise to release it from the socket.
- FC connectors: Unscrew the threaded connector before pulling it out . 6. Protect the Fiber Ends After removal, cover the exposed fiber ends with protective caps or sleeves to prevent contamination or damage. Avoid touching the fiber tip, as dirt or...
