Huawei equipment, including micro-modules for 5G networks, is being phased out across the EU due to security concerns, with binding regulations under consideration to enforce this across all member states.

EU Regulatory Context

The European Commission has classified Huawei and ZTE as high-risk suppliers and is actively working to convert previous non-binding recommendations into legally binding regulations . This means that EU member states may soon be required to phase out Huawei equipment, including micro-modules used in 5G and fiber networks, from both existing infrastructure and future deployments . Countries that fail to comply could face financial penalties under EU law infringement procedures .

Security Concerns

The EU's push to restrict Huawei stems from concerns that Chinese telecom equipment could be exploited for cyber-espionage or interference, potentially compromising critical communications infrastructure . Huawei has consistently denied these allegations, but European security agencies remain cautious, citing the company's suspected links to the Chinese government . The European Commission has emphasized that reliance on Huawei poses a materially higher risk compared to other 5G suppliers
