What Are Fiber Optic Ports?

Fiber optic ports are specialized interfaces on network switches that allow data transmission over optical fiber cables instead of traditional copper Ethernet cables. These ports are commonly found on Ethernet switches for enterprise networks, data centers, and campus backbones, as well as on Fibre Channel (FC) switches used in storage area networks (SANs) for high-performance server-to-storage communication. Unlike standard RJ45 ports, fiber optic ports can handle longer distances, higher bandwidths, and are resistant to electromagnetic interference.

SFP Ports: Modular Flexibility

A widely used type of fiber optic port is the SFP (Small Form-factor Pluggable) port. SFP ports are hot-swappable, modular slots that accept SFP transceiver modules, which determine the type of connection—fiber or copper—and the transmission distance. Key features include:

- **Optical SFP Modules:** Use fiber cables for long-distance communication, supporting multimode or single-mode fiber, and can reach distances up to 150 km.
- **Copper SFP Modules (RJ45):** Convert the SFP slot into a standard Ethernet port for short-range connections, providing flexibility without replacing the switch.
- **Combo Ports:** Some switches offer a single logical interface with both SFP and RJ45...
