

Methods for fixing multiple optical cables

If the cable is still not functioning, locate any physical damage using an Optical Time Domain Reflectometer (OTDR) or visual inspection. Look for cuts, kinks, or excessive bending that may have compromised the fiber .

Step 4: Cut and Strip the Damaged Section
