Article Overview

Mozambique is rapidly expanding electricity access, with a strong focus on renewable energy, off-grid solutions, and regional energy integration, laying the foundation for digital and internet-enabled development.

Electricity Access and Progress

Mozambique has made significant strides in electrification, nearly doubling electricity access from 31% in 2018 to 60% by the end of 2024, providing service to approximately 9.5 million people . The government's “Energia Para Todos” program and the World Bank-supported ProEnergia project have connected over 514,000 households, 400 public facilities, and 1,860 commercial enterprises, improving access to essential services and creating jobs . Access is delivered through a combination of on-grid connections (46%), mini-grids (2%), and solar home systems (8%) .

Energy Generation and Renewable Focus

Mozambique's electricity generation is predominantly renewable, with 78.4% from hydropower, and plans to increase this to 80.6% by 2032 with the completion of projects like Mphanda Nkuwa and upgrades to the Cahora Bassa Hydropower Dam . The country also has untapped solar, wind, and natural gas resources, which are being prioritized under the Energy Transition Strategy to support industrialization, clean energy exports, and regional energy integration . Independent power producers are increasingly participating in generation, while the state-owned Electricidade de Moçambique (EDM) remains the single buyer and system operator for grid-connected areas
