

PoE power supply of the switch

A PoE switch delivers both data and electrical power over a single Ethernet cable to connected devices, following IEEE PoE standards.

How a PoE Switch Works

A PoE (Power over Ethernet) switch functions as both a network switch and a power source. It injects DC power into Ethernet cables, allowing connected devices such as IP cameras, VoIP phones, wireless access points, and IoT devices to receive both data and power through the same cable. When a device is connected, the switch detects whether it supports PoE. If compatible, the switch supplies power along with data; if not, it only transmits data.

Components and Standards

PoE systems consist of:

- PSE (Power Sourcing Equipment): The switch itself or a dedicated PoE injector that provides power.
- PD (Powered Device): Devices that receive power, like cameras or phones.
- Ethernet Cable: Typically Cat5, Cat5e, or Cat6, which carries both power and data.

PoE switches follow IEEE standards:

- IEEE 802.3af (PoE/Type 1): Up to 15.4 W per port.
- IEEE 802.3at (PoE+/Type 2): Up to 25.5 W per port.
- IEEE 802.3bt (PoE++/Type 3 & 4): Up to 60-100 W per port, optionally using all four cable pairs for higher power delivery
