

Requirements for distribution box sockets

Distribution box sockets must be installed following safety, accessibility, and standard compliance guidelines, including proper height, grounding, protection devices, and conduit management.

Placement and Accessibility

Distribution boxes should be installed in dry, well-ventilated, and easily accessible areas to allow safe operation, maintenance, and inspection . For residential installations, the recommended height is 1 to 1.8 meters from the floor, with 1.3 meters suggested for elderly or handicapped users . Industrial installations require adequate clearance around the panel, typically with a maximum width of 1.5 meters, height of 1.2 meters, and depth of 0.5 meters for IP54-rated boards . Ensure the environment is free from water, excessive dust, or other hazards.

Electrical Standards and Compliance

Installations must comply with IEC 60364, IEC 61439, and BS 7671 standards . Key requirements include:

- Use UL/CE-certified components and follow local electrical codes.
- Ensure double insulation and covers for live parts in metallic distribution boards.
- Include protection devices such as circuit breakers, fuses, and surge protectors, with each circuit individually protected
