A Residential Level 2 Distribution Box is a secondary distribution panel that manages three-phase electricity for a building, providing centralized protection and safe power distribution to multiple circuits.

Overview

A Level 2 distribution box in residential settings serves as the secondary distribution point between the main transformer or primary distribution cabinet and the individual unit or household circuits . It typically handles three-phase electricity and distributes power to multiple branch circuits within a building, such as apartments or multi-unit dwellings. Unlike Level 1 (primary) cabinets, which mainly isolate and protect the incoming feeder, Level 2 boxes are designed for direct connection to power equipment and include larger three-phase circuit breakers .

Key Components

- Three-phase main circuit breaker: Protects the entire building feeder and allows safe disconnection for maintenance .
- Branch circuit breakers: Isolate faults at the circuit level, ensuring localized protection.
- Busbars: Oversized copper busbars reduce resistance and heat buildup, minimizing fire risk .
- Residual Current Devices (RCDs): Typically 30mA, these protect circuits in wet or touch-accessible areas like kitchens, bathrooms, and outdoor sockets .
- Surge Protection Devices (SPD): Shield sensitive electronics and smart home syst...
