

Should the switch door of the distribution box be grounded

Yes, the switch door of a distribution box should be grounded to ensure safety and comply with electrical codes.

Why Ground the Door?

Even if the distribution box body is already grounded, the metal door itself can pose a shock hazard. Metal doors can accumulate static electricity or become energized if a loose wire inside contacts the door. Without grounding, anyone touching the door could complete the path to earth and receive a potentially dangerous shock. Grounding the door ensures that any fault current is safely directed to the ground, preventing injury and equipment damage .

Relevant Standards

- NEC 250.148: Requires that all metallic parts of electrical boxes, including doors, be bonded to ground using a designated grounding screw or clip .
- NEC 314.28: Mandates that metal boxes and their components be reliably grounded and bonded .
- NEC 110.26: Ensures safe access to equipment doors, emphasizing that grounding is part of overall safety compliance .
