Safety Considerations

Keeping the distribution box closed prevents accidental contact with live electrical parts, reducing the risk of electric shock or short circuits. Open boxes expose users and maintenance personnel to live wires, which can lead to serious injuries or fatalities. Modern distribution boxes often include mechanical interlocks that prevent the door from opening unless the grounding switch is engaged, further enhancing safety during operation .

Protection from Environmental Factors

Closed distribution boxes protect internal components from dust, moisture, and physical damage. Exposure to rain, dust, or extreme temperatures can accelerate insulation aging, increase contact resistance, and cause overheating or equipment failure. For outdoor or industrial environments, boxes with higher IP or NEMA ratings provide additional protection against water and dust ingress, ensuring long-term reliability .
