

The role of optical port aggregation on a switch



Article Overview

Optical port aggregation combines multiple optical interfaces into a single logical link to increase bandwidth and provide redundancy.

Overview of Optical Port Aggregation

Optical port aggregation allows multiple independent optical interfaces (e.g., 10GE SFP+ ports) to be combined into a single high-bandwidth logical interface (e.g., 40GE) on a switch. This improves throughput, provides redundancy, and enables load balancing across the aggregated links . Aggregation can be static or dynamic using LACP (Link Aggregation Control Protocol) .

Prerequisites

- **Compatible hardware:** Ensure the switch supports optical aggregation and the required optical modules (SFP+, QSFP+) are installed .
- **Matching attributes:** All ports in the aggregation group must have consistent configurations, including speed, duplex mode (full duplex only), VLAN settings, and link type (trunk, hybrid, or access), .
- **Link status:** Physical links must be active before aggregation, especially for static aggregation .
- **Cabling:** Use appropriate optical cables or high-speed 1-to-4 cables for connecting multiple interfaces to a single high-bandwidth port .
