

What are some examples of hazards caused by optical cables

Optical cables pose hazards including physical injury from glass shards, eye damage from laser exposure, chemical risks from cleaning agents, and operational risks from mechanical damage.

Physical Hazards

Fiber optic cables contain tiny glass or plastic strands that can break during handling or installation. These microscopic shards are sharp and can puncture the skin, causing irritation, inflammation, or infection. If inhaled or ingested, they can lead to serious internal injuries. Because the fragments are often difficult to see, proper disposal and clean-up procedures are essential to prevent accidental exposure or contamination of the work area .

Optical Hazards

The light used in fiber optics, often in the infrared spectrum, is invisible to the human eye. This invisibility removes natural protective reflexes like blinking, making direct exposure to laser light extremely dangerous. Eye damage can occur before a person is aware of the exposure, potentially leading to permanent vision impairment .
