

What do the access switch ports look like



Article Overview

Access switch ports are physical interfaces on a switch that connect end devices to a single VLAN, typically using RJ45 or SFP connectors.

Physical Appearance

Access ports are usually RJ45 Ethernet ports on the front panel of a switch, designed for copper cabling (Cat5e, Cat6, or Cat6a) and supporting speeds up to 1 Gbps . In higher-speed or data center environments, access ports may also use SFP or SFP+ modules, which are small, hot-swappable optical or copper interfaces supporting 1-10 Gbps . These ports are typically labeled with numbers and sometimes include LED indicators showing link status and activity.

Function and VLAN Behavior

An access port is configured to carry traffic for a single VLAN. It strips any VLAN tags from incoming frames and ensures that all traffic from the connected device belongs to the assigned VLAN . By default, most switches assign access ports to VLAN 1, but this can be changed using configuration commands like `switchport access vlan` on Cisco switches . Access ports are simpler than trunk ports because they do not handle multiple VLANs or tagged traffic.
