They are often wall-mounted, rack-mounted, or floor-standing and are used in FTTH networks, data centers, or residential installations. **Fiber Splicing Box:** A smaller, specialized enclosure primarily for housing and protecting fiber splices in compact form factors, often used in last-mile FTTH deployments or building entrance facilities. **Fibre Optic Enclosure / Fiber Termination Enclosure (FDE):** These terms emphasize the enclosure's role in organizing, terminating, and distributing fibers, particularly in controlled environments like data centers. In summary, the terminology varies based on location, function, and scale: outdoor splicing applications often use "fiber closure" or "splice closure," while indoor distribution and termination applications use "distribution box," "termination box," or "fiber optic enclosure."
