

What is the core switch called

A core switch is also called a backbone switch or primary switch.

A core switch serves as the high-capacity, high-performance switch at the backbone of a network, centralizing data flow from distribution or aggregation switches and ensuring rapid, reliable routing across the network . Because of its central role, it is sometimes referred to as a backbone switch, highlighting its function as the main conduit for network traffic, or a primary switch, emphasizing its position at the top of the hierarchical network model . In some network designs, particularly in smaller or medium-sized networks, a collapsed core architecture may use a high-performance aggregation switch to perform the functions of both the core and distribution layers, effectively acting as a core switch . Key characteristics of a core/backbone switch include:

- High-speed Layer 3 routing and switching capabilities
 - Large buffer capacity to handle burst traffic
 - Redundancy features such as dual power supplies and hot-swappable modules
 - Aggregation of multiple lower-layer switches for efficient data flow
- Thus, when discussing network architecture, the terms core switch, backbone switch, and primary switch are often used interchangeably to describe the central switch that forms the network's backbone .
