

What kind of cable is used between core switches



Article Overview

Core switches are typically connected using high-speed Ethernet cables (Cat5e/Cat6/Cat6a) for short distances or fiber-optic cables, including MTP/MPO multi-fiber cables, for high-capacity, long-distance links.

Copper Ethernet Cables

For shorter distances within a data center or network rack, twisted-pair Ethernet cables are commonly used. These include Cat5e, Cat6, and Cat6a cables with RJ-45 connectors, supporting speeds from 1 Gbps up to 10 Gbps depending on the cable type and switch port capabilities. Modern switches often support Auto-MDIX, allowing either straight-through or crossover cables to be used without manual configuration. Copper cables are cost-effective and suitable for connections typically under 100 meters.

Fiber-Optic Cables

For high-speed, long-distance, or high-capacity connections, fiber-optic cables are preferred. These can be single-mode (OS2) for long distances or multimode (OM3, OM4, OM5) for shorter distances within a data center. Fiber cables are immune to electromagnetic interference and can support very high data rates, making them ideal for core switch interconnections.
