A passive optical network (PON) refers to the "last mile" segment of a fiber-optic access network connecting an Internet service provider to end users.

Overview

A PON is a point-to-multipoint fiber-optic network that uses passive splitters to distribute a single optical signal from a central office to multiple customer endpoints without requiring powered devices along the distribution path. This architecture is primarily deployed in the last mile, which is the segment of the network that delivers broadband services directly to homes, offices, or other end-user locations.

Key Components

- Optical Line Terminal (OLT): Located at the service provider's central office, it serves as the source of the optical signal.
- Passive Optical Splitters: These unpowered devices divide the optical signal from the OLT to multiple fibers, enabling one fiber to serve many endpoints.
- Optical Network Units (ONUs) or Optical Network Terminals (ONTs): Positioned near the end users, these devices receive the split optical signal and convert it for use by customer equipment.
