

Which wire is in the distribution box

A distribution box contains hot (live), neutral, and ground (earth) wires, each connected to specific components to safely distribute electricity to various circuits.

Types of Wires and Their Functions

Hot (Live) Wires: These wires carry current from the main power supply to the distribution box. In single-phase systems, there is typically one hot wire, while in three-phase systems, there are three (L1, L2, L3). Hot wires are connected to the main breaker or main isolator and then distributed to branch circuit breakers, which supply power to individual circuits like lighting, sockets, or appliances . **Neutral Wires:** Neutral wires complete the electrical circuit by carrying current back to the power source. They are connected to the neutral busbar inside the distribution box, which collects return conductors from all branch circuits. This ensures balanced operation and proper functioning of the electrical system . **Ground (Earth) Wires:** Ground wires provide a safe path for fault currents to dissipate into the earth, protecting both equipment and personnel. These wires are connected to the earth or ground busbar in the distribution box. In case of a short circuit or leakage, the ground wire prevents electric shocks and reduces the risk of fire .

Connections and Components

- **Main Breaker or Main Isolator:** Receives the incoming hot wire(s) and acts as the primary disconnect for the entire system .
- **Busbars:** Copper or metal bars that distribute power from the main breaker to branch circuit breakers
