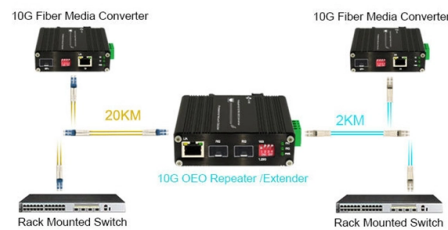


Will the circuit breaker trip if the neutral wire in the distribution box is energized



Overview

Yes, keeping a live wire open can potentially trip a circuit breaker if the neutral and ground are connected. A standard circuit breaker is. By bonding them at the Main Service panel it creates a low impedance path through the equipment grounding conductor back to the transformer through the neutral (grounded) conductor so that the overcurrent device clears.
